

INTERPRETATION CENTRE OF THE ROMAN CAMP *Cáceres el Viejo*



A unique military camp



Walls

The fortified enclosure of the camp is delineated by powerful walls that protect the 24 hectares of land inside.



Doors

Located at the far ends of the fortification, the Porta Principalis Sinistra with flanking towers also connected the interior roads.



Trench

The two trenches that surround the wall are interrupted in front of the doors, which are protected by a smaller, more advanced one.

INTERPRETATION CENTRE OF THE ROMAN CAMP *Cáceres el Viejo*

It was a military camp founded by Quintus Caecilius Metellus around 80 BC. It is one of the few examples of late Republican era camps known in the Iberian Peninsula.
