Unique religious architecture



San Antonio

It was built on the site of the synagogue of the old Jewish quarter after the Expulsion Edict of the Catholic Monarchs, where the beauty of popular architecture is preserved.



Del Vaquero

Erected on the house of Gil Cordero, the pastor who found the stature of the Virgin of Guadalupe, it preserves a replica of this important image in its Baroque reredos.



La Paz

Originally dedicated to San Benito, the porch juts out of its open entrance to the Plaza Mayor, with a magnificent fence topped with the double-headed Austrian eagle.

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In addition to its churches, the landscape of Cáceres preserves interesting hermitages dedicated to prayer and seclusion. The pilgrimages in honour of their devotions are part of the popular festival calendar of the city.

La Soledad

Next to the Plaza de Santa Clara, it has a sober exterior and interior, which highlights the façade and the reredos with the image of the virgin that the construction is named after.



Las Candelas

One of the oldest in the city, it is also called la Consolación. The procession and pilgrimage of the virgin that is preserved inside is well-known.



Other hermitages

those of San Blas, de los Mártires, and del Amparo, as well as the most remote ones of San Benito, Santa Lucía, and Santa Ana are other examples of this religious architecture of Cáceres.
