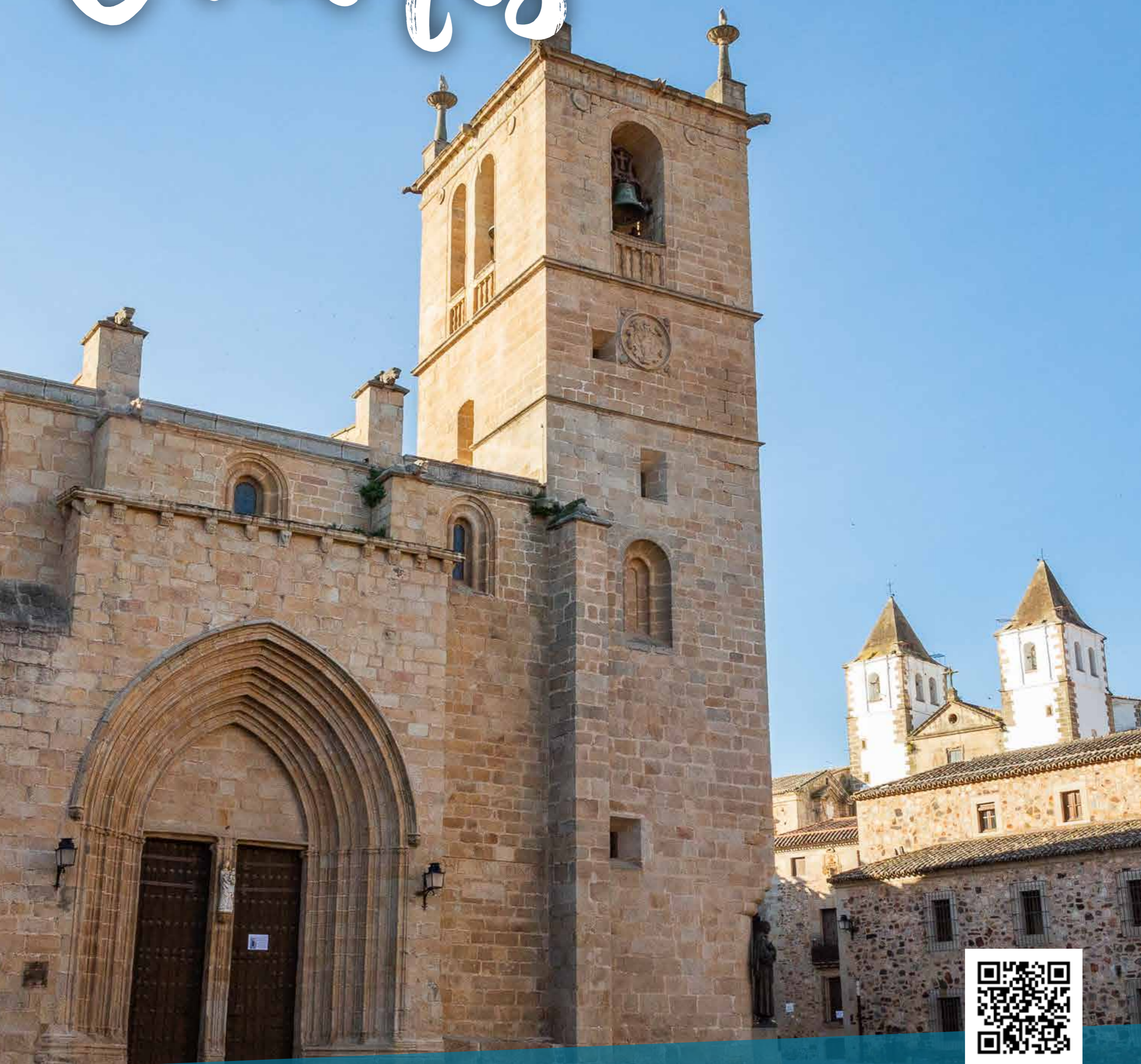

## Time travel is possible in Cáceres

From the Plaza Mayor and next to the Torre de Bujaco on the Almohad wall, the curious Arco de la Estrella opens up to welcome us to the Plaza de Santa María, where the Co-Cathedral and the Episcopal Palace are located. Around this square, the Palaces of Carvajal, Ovando, Mayoralgo and Golfines de Abajo stand proud.

## From the lower district to the upper district

The Jesuit church of San Francisco Javier and its Baroque school stand in the Plaza de San Jorge. Climbing up to the high district, you will reach the plaza and church of San Mateo, around which you can see the Casa del Sol, the Torre de los Sande, the Convent of San Pablo, and the Palacio de las Cigüeñas. You can immediately see the Museum of Cáceres, with its imposing Andalusian cistern.

## From the upper district to the outer walls of Cáceres

Following this route, you can reach the Barrio de San Antonio, the former Old Jewish Quarter. After admiring the Baluarte de los Pozos and leaving the enclosure of the Arco del Cristo, the popular Calle Caleros leads to the church of Santiago and the Godoy Palace, which, along with that of Toledo-Moctezuma, introduce us to Cáceres's contribution to the History of America, where our tour ends.
