Historical origins

The most remote human occupations of Cáceres have been documented in the prehistoric caves of Santa Ana, El Conejar, and Maltravieso. For its part, the Roman camp of “Cáceres el Viejo” was the spark of urban settlements.

Urban evolution

The Palacio de Mayoralgo sums up the 2,000 years of urban history of Cáceres. The findings of the Baluarte de los Pozos and the crypt of the church of San Francisco Javier show us the importance of water in the city.
